Enclosed are the supplementary Regulations and Entry Form for **ROUND 5 of the CSCA Supersprint Series** this year, hosted by MG Car Club Ltd of Sydney, to be run on the Oran Park G.P. Circuit - **on Saturday 2nd August 2008.**

The event is open to financial members of CSCA clubs as listed in the Supplementary Regulations.

The popularity of the Grand Prix Circuit, and the growing popularity of Supersprint, suggests that demand may exceed the fixed supply of 105 places. We recommend that you send your entry form and fee by return mail in order to secure your place.

Please note that the Entry Form can be filled in electronically, and then printed to avoid any issues with illegible hand writing. Be sure you answer all fields and your E-mail address, if appropriate. That will allow us to send your results electronically.

ENSURE YOU HAVE NOMINATED YOUR CLASS AND PREVIOUS BEST TIME FOR THIS TRACK (OR A SECOND TRACK) – IF NOT KNOWN, PLEASE CHECK WITH YOUR CLUB'S CSCA DELEGATE BEFORE YOU ENTER!

Also note that ALL Vehicles Must comply to CAMS General Requirements of Automobiles, most competitors should now be aware of the requirements, including use of an additional bonnet restraint, and taking note of the increased insistence of roll-over protection for Open Cars - but if in doubt contact your club competition secretary.

1. **Authority:** This Event is held under the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC), the CAMS National Competition Rules (NCR) and Standing Regulations for Speed Events, these Supplementary Regulations, and any further regulations issued by the organising club. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au.

9. Event Format

i) Cars will be divided into five (5) colour groups based on previous lap times recorded at the same circuit in the same vehicle. In the event that an driver has not competed at the track before, he/she will be placed in the "First Timers" group to determine their appropriate colour group, or if times are available from another circuit on the table below, then they may be placed in a group relative to those lap times.

The following colour groups will be used (refer table below for splits) and groups sent out in the order below:

Note: Time splits below are approximate & may vary due to the grouping of times nominated on the entry forms.

a) Red – Open Wheelers and Lotus Clubman-style cars (lightweight with little protection)

Each run will comprise a **minimum of 3 flying timed laps**, with the time for the fastest single lap being used for results. Please specify number of proposed laps ...**3**.....

(Note: The Event will not be concluded when this minimum is achieved. Event will only be concluded early for safety reasons or if no competitors available)

Note: Grouping of pairs of cars to form a 'mini-race' anywhere on the circuit is NOT permitted, and action will be taken by the Clerk of the Course if such an incident takes place.

10. Familiarisation Session.

Three familiarisation laps behind a pace car will be given to drivers **that have not previously competed at the track, and have stated this on their Entry Form.** They may be accompanied by a L2S Licence holder or higher with a minimum of 3 years experience as a passenger to assist in pointing out flag points, braking markers, racing lines etc. Such passenger advice will be encouraged, as its benefits are obvious. This will not be at race speed and overtaking will not be permitted. Both occupants must wear appropriate attire as per Section 13 (Driver Safety), below. Familiarisation start time is at 9:20 am and finishes at 9:30 am.

- j) The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without giving a reason in accordance with NCR 83.

- l) Letter/email confirming acceptance of entries *will be sent to each competitor* (only for entries received more than 5 days before the event).
- m) If a competitor advises the event secretary that he/she is unable to attend the event, the following procedure regarding a refund applies:
Refunds will be given to competitors who notify the Event Secretary of their withdrawal not less than 5 working days before the date of the event; MGCC will refund payment by either return of Competitor's cheque or a Refund cheque from MGCC. [acceptable e-mail: stephen.perry@bigpond.com].
- n) Any vehicle presented for scrutineering will for the purpose of the entry be deemed to have competed.

12. Minimum Licences:

Current CAMS Level 2S Licence and a current *club membership card* **of one of the invited** CAMS-affiliated car club are compulsory and must be produced on the day of the Event or entry will be denied.

13. Drivers Safety.

Drivers must wear:

- (a) A helmet that complies with AS1698 or better and carries marking to that effect, or is otherwise approved by CAMS (see Schedule D Section 1 [Headgear] of the General Requirements for Cars and Drivers, in the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport). Helmets must be in good condition and must not have any perforations to the outer surface.
- (b) Non-flammable clothing extending from neck to wrist to ankles, (apparel of nylon or similar material is forbidden). For State Championship Rounds the minimum acceptable is one piece overalls or Driving Suits. The onus will be on the competitor to prove that older overalls/suits still have fire-resistant properties and are not impregnated with oil or fuel.
- (c) Shoes, which completely cover the feet, made entirely of leather or other flame-resistant materials. Shoes that contain any synthetic materials such as nylon are forbidden.
- (d) In open cars goggles or a visor with a lens material other than glass (ie to AS1609- 1981) are mandatory as are leather or Nomex gloves which entirely cover the hands.

Note: Rotary and forced induction engines are subject to capacity multipliers as follows:

Rotaries – multiply by 1.8

Forced Induction – multiply by 1.7

Forced Induction Rotaries – multiply by 3.06

Note: *The Organisers may re-classify any vehicle if they believe it is not eligible for the class in which it has been entered.*

15. Scrutineering Requirements.

- a) All vehicles are to be presented at scrutineering and must comply with Schedules A & B of the CAMS General Requirements for Automobiles (as specific in the CAMS Manual), including
- A fire extinguisher to CAMS requirements and fitted within reach of the driver.
 - A blue triangle, 150mm on each side mounted to indicate the battery location.
 - A secondary method of securing the bonnet.
 - All forward facing glass lenses to be completely covered by a protective film.
 - All loose objects are to be removed from the car.
 - The battery is to be firmly clamped.
 - Vehicles that have been issued with a CAMS Log Book must present the Log Book at Registration and Scrutineering.
- b) Competition numbers are to be positioned on both sides of the vehicle, and must be of a contrasting colour to the surrounding bodywork. They must comply with the current CAMS regulations as to size etc: **Numbers to be on the doors (both sides) and of a height no less than 28 centimetres and must be clearly legible to the timekeeper, and be of a contrasting colour to the surrounding bodywork. Numbers must NOT be on glass. Dual entry numbers must be shown to the scrutineer.**
- c) Drivers and vehicles must be presented in a clean and tidy manner, completely ready for the track including the driver's apparel and helmet. Any tyre or component changes to the vehicle after scrutineering must be approved by the Chief Scrutineer before the vehicle is taken onto the track.
- d) Any vehicle found to be leaking oil or fluids whilst competing will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of Course is satisfied that action has been taken to rectify the leak. Should there be a re-occurrence of the leak then the vehicle will be excluded from the remainder of the event. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.

- e) All vehicles must be fitted with towing hooks or a similar device both front & rear to allow for the speedy removal of a vehicle from a "sand trap" or removal from the circuit in the case of a mechanical failure.
- f) Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.

A sticker will be issued confirming that the vehicle has passed scrutineering prior to it being able to compete.

16. Noise.

Maximum Noise Limit: 95 dba at 30 metres.

Any car found to exceed the maximum noise emission limit will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of Course is satisfied that action has been taken to bring it within the limit. Any vehicle that exceeds the limit on two runs will be excluded from the remainder of the event. If a vehicle exceeds the noise limit on any lap or laps within a run then only those laps in which the vehicle conformed to the requirements will be allowed for the purpose of the results.

17. Pre-Event Scrutineering at Circuit

Start time ...**7.00 am**..... Finish time **8:55 am**.....

Note: The Event will not be delayed due to late arrivals. It is the Drivers' responsibility to ensure their vehicles are scrutineered before the scheduled starting time of the Event. The driver must attend scrutineering personally so that their driving apparel can be checked.

- 18. Drivers' Briefing** It is compulsory for **ALL** Drivers to attend. Scrutineering will cease whilst the Drivers' Briefing is in progress. **Note: 1st Time Drivers to this race track must write "1st Time" next to their names on sign on sheet. Only these drivers will be checked and allowed to run in Familiarisation.**

Time ...**9:00 am**.... Venue **Control Tower**.....

Note: A Driver sign-on sheet must be completed by all Drivers to prove Briefing attendance, failure to sign on may result in penalties being applied by the Stewards of the Meeting. The Organising Club must retain these sheets for any incident or accident reporting.

- 19. Event Schedule. Start time 9:20 am**..... Finish time ...**5:00 pm**.....

First run at 9:20 will be 3 familiarisation laps in groups of 6 behind a pace car(s) for nominated 1st Time Drivers only, followed by a return to the pits, then ongoing runs by colour groups - fastest to slowest (Red, Green, Yellow, Blue and White).

- 20. Replacement Vehicles.** At the sole discretion of the Clerk of the Course, a Driver whose vehicle has broken down may use a replacement vehicle. The replacement vehicle must have been scrutineered, and preferably be in the same class and type as the original vehicle. Where the original vehicle has recorded a time and the scrutineered replacement is not in the same class and type as the original vehicle, the replacement vehicle will not be eligible for prizes and/or trophies.

21. Timing Equipment and Accuracy

Timing will be electronic and to an accuracy of .01 seconds.

22. Results,

A set of results will be available to all competitors within 5 days of the event. Results will be available on the **NATSOFT** website. Competitors requiring a hard copy of the results will need to request them at the time of entry.

Any driver or crew member who is found to be affected by alcohol on the day of the event or practice therefore shall not be permitted to participate. Refer NCR 145A of the Current CAMS Manual.
In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Procedure for Alcohol Testing and CAMS **Anti-Doping** Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be tested for alcohol or other drugs at any time during the event(s). This regulation serves as the required 24-hour notice to Competitors, Crew and Officials.
